On Tuesday we held an earthquake drill just before lunchtime. The students responded quickly to our horns that alert the students to an earthquake drill taking place. We were able to account for all staff and students when we assembled out on the top playground once the all clear was given. Schools in Christchurch shared that their students wanted to be able to come together as a whole school following the February 2022 earthquake.

Drills such as this give our students and staff an opportunity to practise our health and safety procedures. For this week's drill Jo replenished our emergency grab bags and made new emergency bucket toilet facilities for each class.
