#### **Garden to Table**

Mathew and Tessa's students were very excited to harvest the first honey from our hives for the year. Preparation began for this very sticky work on Wednesday when Claire, our beekeeper, brought up the full frames from the hives and stored them overnight in the senior students' kitchen. Many thanks to Julia, Chris, Ali and Caroline who worked alongside Claire and the students to extract the honey and then fill the jars with this season's honey.



*I got to cut the wax caps off the frames using a sharp bread knife. When we had taken off the caps off four frames we then put the four frames into the extractor. We then spun the extractor and the honey spun out.* - Mohamad

*I got to spin the extractor once the frames were placed in it. You can control how you spin the extractor. Working with bees at school is a first for me. –* Elliot
